The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

17 18 Section 1. G.S. 20-183 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

"(c) No law enforcement officer operating an unmarked vehicle at night may stop a vehicle for a violation of this Article except when that officer has probable cause to believe that a felony or an impaired driving offense has been committed by the operator of that vehicle.

For purposes of this subsection, an unmarked vehicle is one without: (i) permanently attached signage or lettering identifying the vehicle as a law enforcement vehicle, (ii) a permanent governmental registration plate, and (iii) a roof mounted visor bar with blue lights."

Section 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Crime Control and Public Safety the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for the 1998-99 fiscal year to publicize the contents of Section 1 of this bill.

Section 3. This act is effective when it becomes law and Section 2 of this bill becomes effective July 1, 1998.
