H 1 HOUSE BILL 904 Short Title: Life Imprison./Repeat Child Molester. (Public) Sponsors: Representatives Mosley; Nichols and Hardy. Referred to: Judiciary I. April 9, 1997 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT A SENTENCE OF LIFE IMPRISONMENT WITHOUT PAROLE SHALL BE IMPOSED FOR A SECOND OR SUBSEQUENT CONVICTION OF A CLASS B1 FELONY IF THERE ARE NO MITIGATING CIRCUMSTANCES AND THE VICTIM IS THIRTEEN YEARS OF AGE OR YOUNGER. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. Article 81B of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read: "§ 15A-1340.16B. Life imprisonment without parole for a second or subsequent conviction of a Class B1 felony. Notwithstanding the sentencing dispositions in G.S. 15A-1340.17, a person convicted of a Class B1 felony shall be sentenced to life imprisonment without parole if: The offense was committed against a victim who was 13 years of age or (1) vounger at the time of the offense: The person has one or more prior convictions of a Class B1 felony; and <u>(2)</u> The court finds that there are no mitigating factors in accordance with (3) G.S. 15A-1340.16(e). If the sentencing court finds that there are mitigating circumstances, then the court shall sentence the person in accordance with G.S. 15A-1340.17.

- 1 (c) A prior conviction of a Class B1 felony shall be proved in accordance with 2 G.S. 15A-1340.14."
  - Section 2. This act becomes effective December 1, 1997, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date.
