1 A SENATE RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING THE HISTORIC ACCOMPLISHMENTS  
2 OF THE SIR WALTER CABINET AND CONGRATULATING THE  
3 ORGANIZATION ON ITS SEVENTY-FIFTH ANNIVERSARY.

4 Whereas, 1998 marks the 75th anniversary of the Sir Walter Cabinet; and

5 Whereas, the Sir Walter Cabinet has enhanced the social life of legislative  
6 sessions and has worked to advance the cultural, economic, and educational welfare of  
7 the State; and

8 Whereas, since its formation, the Sir Walter Cabinet has promoted progressive  
9 legislation such as the following:

10 (1) Aid for the blind and deaf, workers' compensation, better roads, and  
11 highway safety;

12 (2) Improvements in mental health and the conditions of women prisoners;

13 (3) Restoration of Tryon Palace;

14 (4) Assistance to the North Carolina Symphony;

15 (5) Establishment of the North Carolina Museum of Art; and

16 (6) Recognition of children's and women's rights; and

17 Whereas, the Sir Walter Cabinet continues to be a significant part of the  
18 legislative process and contributes to the well-being of the State; Now, therefore,

1 Be it resolved by the Senate:

2           Section 1. The Senate recognizes the historic accomplishments of the Sir  
3 Walter Cabinet and congratulates the organization on 75 years of dedicated commitment  
4 to the betterment of North Carolina.

5           Section 2. The Principal Clerk shall transmit a copy of this resolution to the  
6 Sir Walter Cabinet.

7           Section 3. This resolution is effective upon adoption.
