A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT TO REMOVE THE MATCHING FUNDS REQUIREMENT FOR THE  
2 FUNDS APPROPRIATED IN 1996 TO CONDUCT AN ODOR CONTROL  
3 TECHNOLOGY STUDY, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE ENVIRONMENTAL  
4 REVIEW COMMISSION.

6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

7 Section 1. Section 27.3 of Chapter 18 of the Session Laws of the 1996 Second  
8 Extra Session reads as rewritten:

9 "Sec. 27.3. Of the funds appropriated to the Department of Environment, Health, and  
10 Natural Resources in this act, the sum of six hundred thousand dollars (\$600,000) for the  
11 1996-97 fiscal year shall be transferred to the Board of Governors of The University of  
12 North Carolina for the North Carolina Agricultural Research Service at North Carolina  
13 State University to conduct research into economically feasible odor control technologies  
14 and to provide detailed economic analysis of odor management ~~alternatives; provided these~~  
15 ~~funds are matched with an equal sum from private sources.~~ alternatives. No later than January  
16 1, 1997, the Board of Governors shall report to the Environmental Review Commission  
17 and the Fiscal Research Division on progress under the research, including any findings  
18 and recommendations at that time."

19 Section 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
