1 A HOUSE RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION  
2 OF THE STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA SUPPORT PRESIDENT BUSH'S TAX  
3 RELIEF PROPOSAL.

4           Whereas, federal taxes are the highest they have ever been during peacetime;  
5 and

6           Whereas, all taxpayers should be allowed to keep more of their own money;  
7 and

8           Whereas, the best way to encourage economic growth is to cut marginal tax  
9 rates across all tax brackets; and

10           Whereas, under current tax law, low-income workers often pay the highest  
11 marginal rates; and

12           Whereas, the American people have not received real tax relief in a  
13 generation; and

14           Whereas, President Bush's tax relief plan will contribute to raising the  
15 standard of living for all Americans; and

16           Whereas, President Bush's tax relief plan will increase access to the middle  
17 class for hard working families, treat all middle-class families more fairly, encourage  
18 entrepreneurship and growth, and promote charitable giving and education; and

19           Whereas, under President Bush's tax relief plan, the largest percentage  
20 reductions will go to the lowest-income earners; Now, therefore,

21 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives:

22           **SECTION 1.** The House of Representative of the State of North Carolina  
23 requests our elected representatives in the United States Congress support and work to

1 pass the tax relief plan introduced by President Bush, which includes across-the-board  
2 reductions in marginal rates and reduces the marriage penalty.

3           **SECTION 2.** The Principal Clerk shall transmit a certified copy of this  
4 resolution to each member of North Carolina's Congressional delegation.

5           **SECTION 3.** This resolution is effective upon adoption.
