1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 2 AN ACT TO AMEND THE UMSTEAD ACT TO PROHIBIT THE UNIVERSITY OF 3 NORTH CAROLINA OR ANY OTHER LEGAL ENTITY INCORPORATED OR CREATED TO BENEFIT THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA FROM 4 DEVELOPING, CONSTRUCTING, OWNING, OR OPERATING HOTELS OR 5 OTHER SIMILAR LODGING FACILITIES, RESTAURANTS, SPAS, OR GOLF 6 COURSES EXCEPT IN CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES, AND TO PROVIDE 7 THAT THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY MUST SPECIFICALLY AUTHORIZE 8 9 CERTAIN UNIVERSITY SYSTEM CONTRACTS AND CERTAIN TYPES OF 10 ISSUED **CORPORATIONS** OR LIMITED DEBT BY LIABILITY CORPORATIONS THAT ARE CONTROLLED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF 11 NORTH CAROLINA OR ONE OF ITS CONSTITUENT INSTITUTIONS. 12

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

**SECTION 1.** G.S. 66-58(b) reads as rewritten:

- "(b) The provisions of subsection (a) of this section shall not apply to:
  - (1) Counties and municipalities.
  - (2) The Department of Health and Human Services or the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services for the sale of serums, vaccines, and other like products.
  - (3) The Department of Administration, except that the agency shall not exceed the authority granted in the act creating the agency.
  - (4) The State hospitals for the mentally ill.
  - (5) The Department of Health and Human Services.
- 24 (6) The North Carolina School for the Blind at Raleigh.
- 25 (6a) The Department of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention.
- 26 (7) The North Carolina Schools for the Deaf.

- Nothing herein contained shall be construed to prohibit the (14)engagement in any of the activities described in subsection (a) hereof by a firm, corporation or person who or which is a lessee of space only of the State of North Carolina or any of its departments or agencies; provided the leases shall be awarded by the Department of Administration to the highest bidder, as provided by law in the case of

State contracts and which lease shall be for a term of not less than one 1 2 vear and not more than five years. 3 The State Department of Correction is authorized to purchase and (15)install automobile license tag plant equipment for the purpose of 4 5 manufacturing license tags for the State and local governments and for 6 such other purposes as the Department may direct. 7 The Commissioner of Motor Vehicles, or such other authority as 8 may exercise the authority to purchase automobile license tags is 9 hereby directed to purchase from, and to contract with, the State 10 Department of Correction for the State automobile license tag requirements from year to year. 11 12 The price to be paid to the State Department of Correction for the 13 tags shall be fixed and agreed upon by the Governor, the State 14 Department of Correction, and the Motor Vehicle Commissioner, or 15 such authority as may be authorized to purchase the supplies. 16 (16)Laundry services performed by the Department of Correction may be 17 provided only for agencies and instrumentalities of the State which are 18 supported by State funds and for county or municipally controlled and supported hospitals presently being served by the Department of 19 Correction, or for which services have been contracted or applied for 20 21 in writing, as of May 22, 1973. In addition to the prior sentence, laundry services performed by the Department of Correction may be 22 provided for the Governor Morehead School and the North Carolina 23 School for the Deaf. 24 25 The services shall be limited to wet-washing, drying and ironing of flatwear or flat goods such as towels, sheets and bedding, linens and 26 27 those uniforms prescribed for wear by the institutions and further limited to only flat goods or apparel owned, distributed or controlled 28 entirely by the institutions and shall not include processing by any 29 dry-cleaning methods; provided, however, those garments and items 30 presently being serviced by wet-washing, drying and ironing may in 31 the future, at the election of the Department of Correction, be 32 processed by a dry-cleaning method. 33 The North Carolina Global TransPark Authority or a lessee of the 34 (17)35 Authority. **SECTION 2.** G.S. 66-58 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

43 44 Authority."

- "(h) Notwithstanding the provisions of G.S. 66-58(b)(8), it is unlawful for The University of North Carolina, its constituent institutions, the Centennial Campus of North Carolina State University at Raleigh, the Horace Williams Campus of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, a Millennial Campus of a constituent institution of The University of North Carolina, or any corporation or other legal entity created to benefit any of these institutions or campuses to develop, construct, own, or operate a lodging facility, restaurant, spa, or golf course except as provided by any of the subdivisions of this subsection. For purposes of this subsection, the term 'lodging facility' includes a hotel or motel.
  - (1) The lodging facility is developed and constructed in conjunction with a conference center whose purpose and use is exclusively and directly for continuing education, degree programs, and research of The University of North Carolina or one of its constituent institutions;
  - (2) The lodging facility or golf course is donated as an ongoing business to The University of North Carolina or one of its constituent institutions; or
  - (3) All funding for the lodging facility, restaurant, spa, or golf course is from private contributions, exclusive of infrastructure that is ordinarily associated with such a facility."

**SECTION 3.** Article 1 of Chapter 116 of the General Statutes is amended by adding the following new sections to read:

## "§ 116-13.2. Certain contractual and financial obligations require prior General Assembly approval.

- (a) No debt shall be issued by a corporation or limited liability corporation controlled by The University of North Carolina or a constituent institution without specific prior approval by the General Assembly.
- (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Assembly may modify or void any contract entered into by the Board of Governors or a constituent or affiliated institution that commits to make payments over a period of more than one year if the contract was not specifically authorized by an act of the General Assembly."
- **SECTION 4.** This act is effective when it becomes law. This act does not apply to any lodging facility, restaurant, conference center, spa, or golf course that was already owned, operated, or leased by The University of North Carolina or one of its constituent institutions on June 1, 2002. G.S. 116-13.2, as enacted by this act, applies only to contracts entered into on or after the date this act becomes law.
