## SESSION LAW 2002-150 SENATE BILL 589

AN ACT TO PERMIT THE HIGHWAY USE OF OFF-ROAD VEHICLES USED IN AGRICULTURAL QUARANTINE PROGRAMS.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

**SECTION 1.** G.S. 20-51 is amended by adding a new subdivision to read: "§ **20-51.** Exempt from registration.

The following shall be exempt from the requirement of registration and certificate of title:

(14) Any vehicle that meets all of the following:

<u>a.</u> <u>Is designed for use in work off the highway.</u>

- b. Is used for agricultural quarantine programs under the supervision of the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services.
- <u>c.</u> <u>Is driven</u> or moved on the highway for the purpose of going to and from nonhighway projects.
- d. <u>Is identified in a manner approved by the Division of Motor Vehicles.</u>
- e. Is operated by a person who possesses an identification card issued by the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services."

**SECTION 2.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
