A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO CREATE THE CRIMINAL OFFENSE OF LARCENY OF A MOTOR VEHICLE PART.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. Article 16 of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read:

"§ 14-72.8. Larceny of motor vehicle parts.

(a) Unless the conduct is covered under some other provision of law providing greater punishment, larceny of a motor vehicle part valued at one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or less shall be punished as follows:

(1) For a first offense under this subsection a person is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor.

(2) For a second or subsequent offense under this subsection a person is guilty of a Class I felony.

(b) Unless the conduct is covered under some other provision of law providing greater punishment, larceny of a motor vehicle part valued at more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) shall be punished as follows:

(1) For a first offense under this subsection a person is guilty of a Class H felony.

(2) For a second or subsequent offense under this subsection a person is guilty of a Class G felony."

SECTION 2. This act becomes effective December 1, 2009, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date.
