9	(b) The A	MBER Alert System shall make every effort to disseminate information on		
10	abducted or missing children as quickly as possible when the following criteria are met:			
11	(1)	The child is 17 years of age or younger;

14	(4)	The abduction child is not known or suspected to be have been abducted or		
15		be missing as a result of some act by a parent of the child, unless the child's		
16		life is suspected to be in danger of injury or death;		
17	(4a)	The child is believed:		
18		a. To have been abducted, <del>or</del>		
19		b. To be in danger of injury or <del>death, death, or</del>		
20		<u>c.</u> To be missing and has cognitive impairment that may place the child		
21		in danger of injury or death;		
22	(5)	The child is not a runaway or voluntarily missing; and		

If the abduction of the child is known or suspected to be have been abducted or be missing as result of some act by a parent of the child, the Center, in its discretion, may disseminate information through the AMBER Alert System if the child is believed to be in danger of injury or death.

The abduction-Information regarding the child who has been abducted or is

missing has been reported to and investigated by a law enforcement agency.

- (c) The Center shall adopt guidelines and develop procedures for the statewide implementation of the AMBER Alert System and shall provide education and training to encourage radio and television broadcasters to participate in the System. The Center shall work with the Department of Justice in developing training material regarding the AMBER Alert System for law enforcement, broadcasters, and community interest groups.
- (d) The Center shall consult with the Department of Transportation and develop a procedure for the use of overhead permanent changeable message signs to provide information on the abduction of a child meeting who has been abducted or is missing and meets the criteria



established in subsection (b) of this section, when information is available that would enable motorists to assist law enforcement in the recovery of the <u>abducted or missing</u> child. The Center and the Department of Transportation shall develop guidelines for the content, length, and frequency of any message to be placed on an overhead permanent changeable message sign.

(e) The Center shall consult with the Division of Emergency Management, in the Department of Crime Control and Public Safety, to develop a procedure for the use of the Emergency Alert System to provide information on the abduction of a child meeting who has been abducted or is missing and meets the criteria established in subsection (b) of this section.

 (f) The Department of Crime Control and Public Safety, on behalf of the Center, may accept grants, contributions, devises, bequests, and gifts, which shall be kept in a separate fund, which shall be nonreverting, and shall be used to fund the operations of the Center and the AMBER Alert System."

**SECTION 2.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
