5	SECTION	1. G.S. 138A-3(30) reads as rewritten:			
6	"(30) Publ	lic servants. – All of the following:			
7	a.	Constitutional officers of the State and individuals elected or			
8		appointed as constitutional officers of the State prior to taking office.			
9	b.	Employees of the Office of the Governor.			
10	c.	Heads of all principal State departments, as set forth in G.S. 143B-6,			
11		who are appointed by the Governor.			
12	d.	The chief deputy and chief administrative assistant of each individual			
13		designated under sub-subdivision a. or c. of this subdivision.			
14	e.	Confidential assistants and secretaries as defined in G.S. 126-5(c)(2),			
15		to individuals designated under sub-subdivision a., c., or d. of this			
16		subdivision.			
17	f.	Employees in exempt positions designated in accordance with			
18		G.S. 126-5(d)(1), (2), or (2a) and confidential secretaries to these			
19		individuals.			
20	g.	Any other employees or appointees in the principal State departments			
21		as may be designated by the Governor to the extent that the			
22	•	designation does not conflict with the State Personnel Act.			
23	h.	Judicial employees.			
24	i.	All voting members of boards, including ex officio members,			
25		permanent designees of any voting member, and members serving by			
26		executive, legislative, or judicial branch appointment.			
27	j.	For The University of North Carolina, the voting members of the			
28		Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina, the			
29		president, the vice-presidents, and the chancellors, the			
30		vice-chancellors, and voting members of the boards of trustees of the constituent institutions.
