1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
2 AN ACT TO MAKE CHANGES TO DRIVERS LICENSE RENEWAL PERIODS.  
3 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

4 **SECTION 1.** G.S. 20-7(c) reads as rewritten:

5 "(c) Tests. – To demonstrate physical and mental ability, a person must pass an  
6 examination. The examination may include road tests, vision tests, oral tests, and, in the case of  
7 literate applicants, written tests, as the Division may require. The tests must ensure that an  
8 applicant recognizes the handicapped international symbol of access, as defined in  
9 G.S. 20-37.5. ~~The~~ Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the Division may not  
10 require a person who applies to renew a license that has not expired to take a written test or a  
11 road test unless one or more of the following applies:

- 12 (1) The person has been convicted of a traffic violation since the person's license  
13 was last issued.  
14 (2) The applicant suffers from a mental or physical condition that impairs the  
15 person's ability to drive a motor vehicle.

16 The Division shall require any person who is at least 85 years old to take a road test. The  
17 Division may not require a person who is at least 60 years old to parallel park a motor vehicle  
18 as part of a road test."

19 **SECTION 2.** G.S. 20-7(f) reads as rewritten:

20 "(f) Duration and Renewal of Licenses. – Drivers licenses shall be issued and renewed  
21 pursuant to the provisions of this subsection:

- 22 (1) Duration of license for persons under age 18. – A full provisional license  
23 issued to a person under the age of 18 expires on the person's twenty-first  
24 birthday.  
25 (2) Duration of original license for persons at least 18 years of age or older. – A  
26 drivers license issued to a person at least 18 years old but less than ~~54~~65  
27 years old expires on the birthday of the licensee in the eighth year after  
28 issuance. A drivers license issued to a person at least ~~54~~65 years old but less  
29 than 75 years old expires on the birthday of the licensee in the fifth year after  
30 issuance. A drivers license issued to a person at least 75 years old expires on  
31 the birthday of the licensee in the third year after issuance. A commercial  
32 drivers license that has a vehicles carrying passengers (P) and school bus (S)  
33 endorsement issued pursuant to G.S. 20-37.16 shall expire on the birth date  
34 of the licensee three years after the date of issuance, if the licensee is  
35 certified to drive a school bus in North Carolina.



1 (2a) Duration of renewed licenses. – A renewed drivers license that was issued  
2 by the Division to a person at least 18 years old but less than ~~54-65~~ years old  
3 expires eight years after the expiration date of the license that is renewed. A  
4 renewed drivers license that was issued by the Division to a person at least  
5 ~~54-65~~ years old but less than 75 years old expires five years after the  
6 expiration date of the license that is renewed. A renewed drivers license that  
7 was issued by the Division to a person at least 75 years old expires three  
8 years after the expiration date of the license that is renewed.

9 (3) Duration of license for certain other drivers. – The durations listed in  
10 subdivisions (1), (2) and (2a) of this subsection are valid unless the Division  
11 determines that a license of shorter duration should be issued when the  
12 applicant holds valid documentation issued by, or under the authority of, the  
13 United States government that demonstrates the applicant's legal presence of  
14 limited duration in the United States. In no event shall a license of limited  
15 duration expire later than the expiration of the authorization for the  
16 applicant's legal presence in the United States.

17 (3a) When to renew. – A person may apply to the Division to renew a license  
18 during the 180-day period before the license expires. The Division may not  
19 accept an application for renewal made before the 180-day period begins.

20 (4) Renewal by mail. – The Division may renew by mail a drivers license issued  
21 by the Division to a person who meets any of the following descriptions:

22 a. Is serving on active duty in the armed forces of the United States and  
23 is stationed outside this State.

24 b. Is a resident of this State and has been residing outside the State for  
25 at least 30 continuous days.

26 When renewing a license by mail, the Division may waive the examination  
27 that would otherwise be required for the renewal and may impose any  
28 conditions it finds advisable. A license renewed by mail is a temporary  
29 license that expires 60 days after the person to whom it is issued returns to  
30 this State.

31 (5) License to be sent by mail. – The Division shall issue to the applicant a  
32 temporary driving certificate valid for 20 days, unless the applicant is  
33 applying for renewal by mail under subdivision (4) of this subsection. The  
34 temporary driving certificate shall be valid for driving purposes only and  
35 shall not be valid for identification purposes. The Division shall produce the  
36 applicant's drivers license at a central location and send it to the applicant by  
37 first-class mail at the residence address provided by the applicant, unless the  
38 applicant is ineligible for mail delivery by the United States Postal Service at  
39 the applicant's residence. If the United States Postal Service documents that  
40 it does not deliver to the residential address provided by the applicant, and  
41 the Division has verified the applicant's residential address by other means,  
42 the Division may mail the drivers license to the post office box provided by  
43 the applicant. Applicants whose only mailing address prior to July 1, 2008,  
44 was a post office box in this State may continue to receive their license at  
45 that post office box, provided the applicant's residential address has been  
46 verified by the Division."

47 **SECTION 3.** This act becomes effective October 1, 2009, and applies to licenses  
48 issued or renewed on or after that date.
