2 AN ACT TO MAKE TECHNICAL AND CONFORMING CHANGES TO STATUTES
3 RELATED TO EXPUNCTION OF RECORDS; TO REQUIRE STATE AND NATIONAL
4 CRIMINAL RECORD CHECKS WHEN EXPUNGING RECORDS; AND TO REQUIRE
5 SEX OFFENDERS RESIDING IN THIS STATE TO REGISTER AS A SEX OFFENDER
6 FOR CONVICTIONS OBTAINED OUTSIDE THIS STATE.

7 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

8 **SECTION 1.** G.S. 14-50.30 reads as rewritten:

9 "**§ 14-50.30. Expunction of records.**

10 Any person who has not previously been convicted of any felony or misdemeanor other
11 than a traffic violation under the laws of the United States or the laws of this State or any other
12 state, may, if the offense was committed before the person attained the age of 18 years, be
13 eligible to apply for expunction of certain offenses under this Article pursuant to
14 G.S. 15A-145.1.

15 ~~information and that the conviction be expunged from the records of the court, agencies, the~~
16 ~~Department of Correction, the Division of Motor Vehicles, and any other State or local~~
17 ~~government agencies identified by the petitioner as conviction petitioner's shall notify State and~~
18 ~~local agencies of the court's order as provided in G.S. 15A-150."~~

19 **SECTION 2.** G.S. 15A-145(a) reads as rewritten:

20 "(a) Whenever any person who has not previously been convicted of any felony, or
21 misdemeanor other than a traffic violation, under the laws of the United States, the laws of this
22 State or any other state, (i) pleads guilty to or is guilty of a misdemeanor other than a traffic
23 violation, and the offense was committed before the person attained the age of 18 years, or (ii)
24 pleads guilty to or is guilty of a misdemeanor possession of alcohol pursuant to
25 G.S. 18B-302(b)(1), and the offense was committed before the person attained the age of 21
26 years, he may file a petition in the court where he was convicted for expunction of the
27 misdemeanor from his criminal record. The petition cannot be filed earlier than: (i) two years
28 after the date of the conviction, or (ii) the completion of any period of probation, whichever
29 occurs later, and the petition shall contain, but not be limited to, the following:

- 30 (1) An affidavit by the petitioner that he has been of good behavior for the
31 two-year period since the date of conviction of the misdemeanor in question
32 and has not been convicted of any felony, or misdemeanor other than a
33 traffic violation, under the laws of the United States or the laws of this State
34 or any other state.
- 35 (2) Verified affidavits of two persons who are not related to the petitioner or to
36 each other by blood or marriage, that they know the character and reputation



1 of the petitioner in the community in which he lives and that his character
2 and reputation are good.

3 (3) A statement that the petition is a motion in the cause in the case wherein the
4 petitioner was convicted.

5 (4) ~~Affidavits of the clerk of superior court, chief of police, where appropriate,
6 and sheriff of the county in which the petitioner was convicted and, if
7 different, the county of which the petitioner is a resident, showing that the
8 petitioner has not been convicted of a felony or misdemeanor other than a
9 traffic violation under the laws of this State at any time prior to the
10 conviction for the misdemeanor in question or during the two-year period
11 following that conviction.~~

12 (4a) An application on a form approved by the Administrative Office of the
13 Courts requesting and authorizing a name-based State and national criminal
14 record check by the Department of Justice using any information required by
15 the Administrative Office of the Courts to identify the individual and a
16 search of the confidential record of expunctions maintained by the
17 Administrative Office of the Courts. The application shall be forwarded to
18 the Department of Justice and to the Administrative Office of the Courts,
19 which shall conduct the searches and report their findings to the court.

20 (5) An affidavit by the petitioner that no restitution orders or civil judgments
21 representing amounts ordered for restitution entered against him are
22 outstanding.

23 The petition shall be served upon the district attorney of the court wherein the case was
24 tried resulting in conviction. The district attorney shall have 10 days thereafter in which to file
25 any objection thereto and shall be duly notified as to the date of the hearing of the petition.

26 The judge to whom the petition is presented is authorized to call upon a probation officer
27 for any additional investigation or verification of the petitioner's conduct during the two-year
28 period that he deems desirable."

29 **SECTION 3.** G.S. 15A-145(d1) reads as rewritten:

30 "(d1) Notwithstanding subsection (a) of this section and any other provision of law, a
31 person may file a petition in the court where the person was convicted for expunction of a
32 misdemeanor conviction from the person's criminal record if the person has no prior felony
33 convictions and was convicted for misdemeanor larceny pursuant to G.S. 14-72(a) more than
34 15 years prior to the filing of the petition.

35 The petition shall contain, but not be limited to, the following:

36 (1) An affidavit by the petitioner that he has not been convicted of any felony,
37 has been of good behavior for the 15-year period preceding the filing of the
38 petition, and has not been convicted of any misdemeanor other than a traffic
39 violation, under the laws of the United States or the laws of this State or any
40 other state during the 15-year period.

41 (2) Verified affidavits of two persons who are not related to the petitioner or to
42 each other by blood or marriage, that they know the character and reputation
43 of the petitioner in the community in which he lives and that his character
44 and reputation are good.

45 (3) A statement that the petition is a motion in the cause in the case wherein the
46 petitioner was convicted.

47 (4) ~~Affidavits of the clerk of superior court, chief of police, where appropriate,
48 and sheriff of the county in which the petitioner was convicted and, if
49 different, the county of which the petitioner is a resident, showing that the
50 petitioner has not been convicted of a felony or misdemeanor other than a~~

1 ~~traffic violation under the laws of this State during the 10-year period~~
2 ~~preceding the filing of the petition.~~

3 (4a) An application on a form approved by the Administrative Office of the
4 Courts requesting and authorizing a name-based State and national criminal
5 record check by the Department of Justice using any information required by
6 the Administrative Office of the Courts to identify the individual and a
7 search of the confidential record of expunctions maintained by the
8 Administrative Office of the Courts. The application shall be forwarded to
9 the Department of Justice and to the Administrative Office of the Courts,
10 which shall conduct the searches and report their findings to the court.

11 (5) An affidavit by the petitioner that no restitution orders or civil judgments
12 representing amounts ordered for restitution entered against him are
13 outstanding.

14 The petition shall be served upon the district attorney of the court wherein the case was
15 tried resulting in conviction. The district attorney shall have 10 days thereafter in which to file
16 any objection thereto and shall be duly notified as to the date of the hearing of the petition.

17 The judge to whom the petition is presented is authorized to call upon a probation officer
18 for any additional investigation or verification of the petitioner's conduct during the
19 ~~10-year~~15-year period that he deems desirable.

20 If the court, after hearing, finds that the petitioner had remained of good behavior and been
21 free on conviction of any felony or misdemeanor, other than a traffic violation, during the
22 ~~10-year~~15-year period preceding the petition, the petitioner has no outstanding restitution
23 orders or civil judgments representing amounts ordered for restitution entered against him, and
24 the petitioner was convicted of misdemeanor larceny pursuant to G.S. 14-72(a) more than ~~10~~15
25 years prior to the filing of the petition, it shall order that such person be restored, in the
26 contemplation of the law, to the status he occupied before such arrest or indictment or
27 information. No person as to whom such order has been entered shall be held thereafter under
28 any provision of any laws to be guilty of perjury or otherwise giving a false statement by
29 reason of his failure to recite or acknowledge such arrest, or indictment, information, or trial, or
30 response to any inquiry made of him for any purpose.

31 The provisions of subsections (c), (d), and (e) of this section shall apply to a petition for
32 expunction filed or granted pursuant to this subsection."

33 **SECTION 4.** G.S. 15A-145.1 reads as rewritten:

34 **"§ 15A-145.1. Expunction of records for first offenders under the age of 18 at the time of**
35 **conviction of certain gang offenses.**

36 (a) Whenever any person who has not previously been convicted of any felony or
37 misdemeanor other than a traffic violation under the laws of the United States or the laws of
38 this State or any other state pleads guilty to or is guilty of (i) a Class H felony under Article
39 13A of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes or (ii) an enhanced offense under G.S. 14-50.22, or
40 has been discharged and had the proceedings against the person dismissed pursuant to
41 G.S. 14-50.29, and the offense was committed before the person attained the age of 18 years,
42 the person may file a petition in the court where the person was convicted for expunction of the
43 offense from the person's criminal record. Except as provided in G.S. 14-50.29 upon discharge
44 and dismissal, the petition cannot be filed earlier than (i) two years after the date of the
45 conviction or (ii) the completion of any period of probation, whichever occurs later. The
46 petition shall contain, but not be limited to, the following:

47 (1) An affidavit by the petitioner that the petitioner has been of good behavior
48 (i) during the period of probation since the decision to defer further
49 proceedings on the offense in question pursuant to G.S. 14-50.29 or (ii)
50 during the two-year period since the date of conviction of the offense in
51 question, whichever applies, and has not been convicted of any felony or

- 1 misdemeanor other than a traffic violation under the laws of the United
2 States or the laws of this State or any other state.
- 3 (2) Verified affidavits of two persons who are not related to the petitioner or to
4 each other by blood or marriage, that they know the character and reputation
5 of the petitioner in the community in which the petitioner lives, and that the
6 petitioner's character and reputation are good.
- 7 (3) If the petition is filed subsequent to conviction of the offense in question, a
8 statement that the petition is a motion in the cause in the case wherein the
9 petitioner was convicted.
- 10 (4) ~~Affidavits of the clerk of superior court, chief of police, where appropriate,
11 and sheriff of the county in which the petitioner was convicted and, if
12 different, the county of which the petitioner is a resident, showing that the
13 petitioner has not been convicted of a felony or misdemeanor other than a
14 traffic violation under the laws of this State (i) during the period of probation
15 since the decision to defer further proceedings on the offense in question
16 pursuant to G.S. 14-50.29 or (ii) at any time prior to the conviction for the
17 offense in question or during the two-year period following that conviction,
18 whichever applies.~~
- 19 (4a) An application on a form approved by the Administrative Office of the
20 Courts requesting and authorizing a name-based State and national criminal
21 record check by the Department of Justice using any information required by
22 the Administrative Office of the Courts to identify the individual and a
23 search of the confidential record of expunctions maintained by the
24 Administrative Office of the Courts. The application shall be forwarded to
25 the Department of Justice and to the Administrative Office of the Courts,
26 which shall conduct the searches and report their findings to the court.
- 27 (5) An affidavit by the petitioner that no restitution orders or civil judgments
28 representing amounts ordered for restitution entered against the petitioner
29 are outstanding.

30 The petition shall be served upon the district attorney of the court wherein the case was
31 tried resulting in conviction. The district attorney shall have 10 days thereafter in which to file
32 any objection thereto and shall be duly notified as to the date of the hearing of the petition.

33 The judge to whom the petition is presented is authorized to call upon a probation officer
34 for any additional investigation or verification of the petitioner's conduct during the
35 probationary period or during the two-year period after conviction.

36 (b) If the court, after hearing, finds that (i) the petitioner was dismissed and the
37 proceedings against the petitioner discharged pursuant to G.S. 14-50.29 and that the person had
38 not yet attained 18 years of age at the time of the offense or (ii) the petitioner has remained of
39 good behavior and been free of conviction of any felony or misdemeanor other than a traffic
40 violation for two years from the date of conviction of the offense in question, the petitioner has
41 no outstanding restitution orders or civil judgments representing amounts ordered for restitution
42 entered against ~~him~~the petitioner, and the petitioner had not attained the age of 18 years at the
43 time of the offense in question, it shall order that such person be restored, in the contemplation
44 of the law, to the status occupied by the petitioner before such arrest or indictment or
45 ~~information.~~information, and that the record be expunged from the records of the court. No
46 person as to whom such order has been entered shall be held thereafter under any provision of
47 any laws to be guilty of perjury or otherwise giving a false statement by reason of the person's
48 failure to recite or acknowledge such arrest, or indictment or information, or trial, or response
49 to any inquiry made of the person for any purpose. The court shall also ~~order that the said~~
50 ~~conviction be expunged from the records of the court and direct all law enforcement agencies~~
51 agencies, the Department of Correction, the Division of Motor Vehicles, and any other State or

1 local government agencies identified by the petitioner as bearing record of the same to expunge
2 their records of the petitioner's criminal charge and any conviction as the result of a
3 criminal resulting from the charge. The clerk shall forward a certified copy of the order to the
4 sheriff, chief of police, or other arresting agency. The sheriff, chief of police, or head of such
5 other arresting agency shall then transmit the copy of the order with a form supplied by the
6 State Bureau of Investigation to the State Bureau of Investigation, and the State Bureau of
7 Investigation shall forward the order to the Federal Bureau of Investigation. notify State and
8 local agencies of the court's order as provided in G.S. 15A-150.

9 (c) This section is supplemental and in addition to existing law and shall not be
10 construed so as to repeal any existing provision contained in the General Statutes of North
11 Carolina."

12 **SECTION 5.** G.S. 15A-145.2 reads as rewritten:

13 **"§ 15A-145.2. Expunction of records for first offenders not over 21 years of age at the**
14 **time of the offense of certain drug offenses.**

15 (a) Whenever a person is discharged, and the proceedings against the person dismissed,
16 pursuant to G.S. 90-96(a) or (a1), and the person was not over 21 years of age at the time of the
17 offense, the person may apply to the court for an order to expunge from all official records
18 ~~(other than the confidential file to be retained by the Administrative Office of the Courts under~~
19 ~~G.S. 90-96(e))~~ records, other than the confidential files retained under G.S. 15A-151, all
20 recordation relating to his the person's arrest, indictment or information, trial, finding of guilty,
21 and dismissal and discharge pursuant to this section. The applicant shall attach to the
22 application the following:

23 (1) An affidavit by the ~~applicant~~ petitioner that he or she has been of good
24 behavior during the period of probation since the decision to defer further
25 proceedings on the offense in question and has not been convicted of any
26 felony or misdemeanor other than a traffic violation under the laws of the
27 United States or the laws of this State or any other state;

28 (2) Verified affidavits by two persons who are not related to the ~~applicant~~
29 petitioner or to each other by blood or marriage, that they know the character
30 and reputation of the petitioner in the community in which he or she lives,
31 and that ~~his the~~ petitioner's character and reputation are good;

32 (3) ~~Affidavits of the clerk of superior court, chief of police, where appropriate,~~
33 ~~and sheriff of the county in which the petitioner was convicted, and, if~~
34 ~~different, the county of which the petitioner is a resident, showing that the~~
35 ~~applicant has not been convicted of a felony or misdemeanor other than a~~
36 ~~traffic violation under the laws of this State at any time prior to the~~
37 ~~conviction for the offense in question or during the period of probation~~
38 ~~following the decision to defer further proceedings on the offense in~~
39 ~~question.~~

40 (3a) An application on a form approved by the Administrative Office of the
41 Courts requesting and authorizing a name-based State and national criminal
42 record check by the Department of Justice using any information required by
43 the Administrative Office of the Courts to identify the individual and a
44 search of the confidential record of expunctions maintained by the
45 Administrative Office of the Courts. The application shall be forwarded to
46 the Department of Justice and to the Administrative Office of the Courts,
47 which shall conduct the searches and report their findings to the court.

48 The judge to whom the petition is presented is authorized to call upon a probation officer
49 for any additional investigation or verification of the petitioner's conduct during the
50 probationary period deemed desirable.

1 If the court determines, after hearing, that such person was discharged and the proceedings
2 against him or her dismissed and that ~~he~~ the person was not over 21 years of age at the time of
3 the offense, it shall enter such order. The effect of such order shall be to restore such person in
4 the contemplation of the law to the status ~~he~~ the person occupied before such arrest or
5 indictment or information. No person as to whom such order was entered shall be held
6 thereafter under any provision of any law to be guilty of perjury or otherwise giving a false
7 statement by reason of ~~his~~ the person's failures to recite or acknowledge such arrest, or
8 indictment or information, or trial in response to any inquiry made of him or her for any
9 purpose.

10 The court shall also order that ~~said conviction and the records relating thereto~~ all records of
11 the proceeding be expunged from the records of the court and direct all law enforcement
12 ~~agencies~~ agencies, the Department of Correction, the Division of Motor Vehicles, and any other
13 State and local government agencies identified by the petitioner as bearing records of the same
14 to expunge their records of the conviction proceeding. The clerk shall ~~forward a certified copy~~
15 ~~of the order to the sheriff, chief of police, or other arresting agency, as appropriate, and the~~
16 ~~sheriff, chief of police, or other arresting agency, as appropriate, shall forward such order to the~~
17 ~~State Bureau of Investigation with a form supplied by the State Bureau of Investigation. The~~
18 ~~State Bureau of Investigation shall forward the court order in like manner to the Federal Bureau~~
19 ~~of Investigation.~~ notify State and local agencies of the court's order as provided in
20 G.S. 15A-150.

21 (b) Whenever any person is charged with a misdemeanor under Article 5 of Chapter 90
22 of the General Statutes by possessing a controlled substance included within Schedules II
23 through VI of Article 5 of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes or a felony under
24 G.S. 90-95(a)(3) by possessing less than one gram of cocaine, upon dismissal by the State of
25 the charges against ~~him~~ the person, upon entry of a nolle prosequi, or upon a finding of not
26 guilty or other adjudication of innocence, such person may apply to the court for an order to
27 expunge from all official records all recordation relating to his or her arrest, indictment or
28 information, or trial. If the court determines, after hearing, that such person was not over 21
29 years of age at the time the offense for which the person was charged occurred, it shall enter
30 such order. The clerk shall notify State and local agencies of the court's order as provided in
31 G.S. 15A-150. No person as to whom such order has been entered shall be held thereafter under
32 any provision of any law to be guilty of perjury or otherwise giving a false statement by reason
33 of ~~his~~ the person's failures to recite or acknowledge such arrest, or indictment or information, or
34 trial in response to any inquiry made of him or her for any purpose.

35 (c) Whenever any person who has not previously been convicted of an offense under
36 Article 5 of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes or under any statute of the United States or any
37 state relating to controlled substances included in any schedule of Article 5 of Chapter 90 of the
38 General Statutes or to that paraphernalia included in Article 5B of Chapter 90 of the General
39 Statutes pleads guilty to or has been found guilty of (i) a misdemeanor under Article 5 of
40 Chapter 90 of the General Statutes by possessing a controlled substance included within
41 Schedules II through VI of Article 5 of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes or by possessing
42 drug paraphernalia as prohibited by G.S. 90-113.22 or (ii) a felony under G.S. 90-95(a)(3) by
43 possessing less than one gram of cocaine, the court may, upon application of the person not
44 sooner than 12 months after conviction, order cancellation of the judgment of conviction and
45 expunction of the records of ~~his~~ the person's arrest, indictment or information, trial, and
46 conviction. A conviction in which the judgment of conviction has been canceled and the
47 records expunged pursuant to this subsection shall not be thereafter deemed a conviction for
48 purposes of this subsection or for purposes of disqualifications or liabilities imposed by law
49 upon conviction of a crime, including the additional penalties imposed for second or
50 subsequent convictions of Article 5 of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes. Cancellation and
51 expunction under this subsection may occur only once with respect to any person. Disposition

1 of a case under this subsection at the district court division of the General Court of Justice shall
2 be final for the purpose of appeal.

3 The granting of an application filed under this subsection shall cause the issue of an order to
4 expunge from all official records ~~(other than the confidential file to be retained by the~~
5 ~~Administrative Office of the Courts under G.S. 90-96(e))~~ records, other than the confidential
6 files retained under G.S. 15A-151, all recordation relating to the petitioner's arrest, indictment
7 or information, trial, finding of guilty, judgment of conviction, cancellation of the judgment,
8 and expunction of records pursuant to this subsection.

9 The judge to whom the petition is presented is authorized to call upon a probation officer
10 for additional investigation or verification of the petitioner's conduct since conviction. If the
11 court determines that the petitioner was convicted of (i) a misdemeanor under Article 5 of
12 Chapter 90 of the General Statutes for possessing a controlled substance included within
13 Schedules II through VI of Article 5 of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes or for possessing
14 drug paraphernalia as prohibited in G.S. 90-113.22 or (ii) a felony under G.S. 90-95(a)(3) for
15 possession of less than one gram of cocaine, that ~~he~~ the petitioner was not over 21 years of age
16 at the time of the offense, that ~~he~~ the petitioner has been of good behavior since his or her
17 conviction, that ~~he~~ the petitioner has successfully completed a drug education program
18 approved for this purpose by the Department of Health and Human Services, and that ~~he~~ the
19 petitioner has not been convicted of a felony or misdemeanor other than a traffic violation
20 under the laws of this State at any time prior to or since the conviction for the offense in
21 question, it shall enter an order of expunction of the petitioner's court record. The effect of such
22 order shall be to restore the petitioner in the contemplation of the law to the status ~~he~~ the
23 petitioner occupied before arrest or indictment or information or conviction. No person as to
24 whom such order was entered shall be held thereafter under any provision of any law to be
25 guilty of perjury or otherwise giving a false statement by reason of ~~his~~ the person's failures to
26 recite or acknowledge such arrest, or indictment or information, or conviction, or trial in
27 response to any inquiry made of him or her for any purpose. The judge may waive the
28 condition that the petitioner attend the drug education school if the judge makes a specific
29 finding that there was no drug education school within a reasonable distance of the defendant's
30 residence or that there were specific extenuating circumstances which made it likely that the
31 petitioner would not benefit from the program of instruction.

32 The court shall also order all law enforcement ~~agencies~~ agencies, the Department of
33 Correction, the Division of Motor Vehicles, and any other State or local agencies identified by
34 the petitioner as bearing records of the conviction and records relating thereto to expunge their
35 records of the conviction. The clerk shall ~~forward a certified copy of the order to the sheriff,~~
36 ~~chief of police, or other arresting agency, as appropriate, and the arresting agency shall forward~~
37 ~~the order to the State Bureau of Investigation with a form supplied by the State Bureau of~~
38 ~~Investigation. The State Bureau of Investigation shall forward the court order in like manner to~~
39 ~~the Federal Bureau of Investigation.~~ notify State and local agencies of the court's order as
40 provided in G.S. 15A-150.

41 ~~The clerk of superior court in each county in North Carolina shall, as soon as practicable~~
42 ~~after each term of court in his county, file with the Administrative Office of the Courts the~~
43 ~~names of those persons whose judgments of convictions have been canceled and expunged~~
44 ~~under the provisions of this subsection, and the Administrative Office of the Courts shall~~
45 ~~maintain a confidential file containing the names of persons whose judgments of convictions~~
46 ~~have been canceled and expunged. The information contained in the file shall be disclosed only~~
47 ~~to judges of the General Court of Justice of North Carolina for the purpose of ascertaining~~
48 ~~whether any person charged with an offense under Article 5 of Chapter 90 of the General~~
49 ~~Statutes has been previously granted cancellation and expunction of a judgment of conviction~~
50 ~~pursuant to the terms of this subsection.~~

1 (d) A person who files a petition for expunction of a criminal record under this section
2 must pay the clerk of superior court a fee of sixty-five dollars (\$65.00) at the time the petition
3 is filed. Fees collected under this subsection shall be deposited in the General Fund. This
4 subsection does not apply to petitions filed by an indigent."

5 **SECTION 6.** G.S. 15A-145.3 reads as rewritten:

6 "**§ 15A-145.3. Expunction of records for first offenders not over 21 years of age at the**
7 **time of the offense of certain toxic vapors offenses.**

8 (a) Whenever a person is discharged and the proceedings against the person dismissed
9 under G.S. 90-113.14(a) or (a1), such person, if he or she was not over 21 years of age at the
10 time of the offense, may apply to the court for an order to expunge from all official ~~records~~
11 ~~(other than the confidential file to be retained by the Administrative Office of the Courts under~~
12 ~~G.S. 90-113.14(e))~~ records, other than the confidential files retained under G.S. 15A-151, all
13 recordation relating to ~~his~~ the person's arrest, indictment or information, trial, finding of guilty,
14 and dismissal and discharge pursuant to this section. The applicant shall attach to the
15 application the following:

- 16 (1) An affidavit by the ~~applicant that he~~ petitioner that the petitioner has been of
17 good behavior during the period of probation since the decision to defer
18 further proceedings on the misdemeanor in question and has not been
19 convicted of any felony or misdemeanor other than a traffic violation under
20 the laws of the United States or the laws of this State or any other state;
