A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO CLARIFY THE REQUIREMENTS OF CONTRACTS ENTERED INTO BY THE DIVISION OF MOTOR VEHICLES FOR THE PURPOSES OF ISSUING LICENSE PLATES THROUGH PRIVATE OR LOCAL GOVERNMENT ENTITIES.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

**SECTION 1.** G.S. 20-63(h) reads as rewritten:

Commission Contracts for Issuance of Plates and Certificates. - All registration plates, registration certificates, and certificates of title issued by the Division, outside of those issued from the Charlotte and Raleigh offices of the Division and those issued and handled through the United States mail, shall be issued insofar as practicable and possible through commission contracts entered into by the Division for the issuance of the plates and certificates in localities throughout North Carolina with persons, firms, corporations or governmental subdivisions of the State of North Carolina. The Division shall make a reasonable effort in every locality, except as noted above, to enter into a commission contract for the issuance of the plates and certificates and a record of these efforts shall be maintained in the Division. In the event the Division is unsuccessful in making commission contracts, it shall issue the plates and certificates through the regular employees of the Division. Division, provided the Division shall not open any new commission contract locations or utilize any Division mobile units, within 10 miles of a private contract location for which a contract was executed on or before July 1, 2008. Whenever registration plates, registration certificates, and certificates of title are issued by the Division through commission contract arrangements, the Division shall provide proper supervision of the distribution. Nothing contained in this subsection will allow or permit the operation of fewer outlets in any county in this State than are now being operated.operated except that no less than 105 nongovernmental private commission contracts shall remain in effect throughout the State.

When the Division enters into a contract with a person, firm, corporation, other legal entity, or a governmental subdivision of this State, the Division shall provide, at no cost to the commission contractor, all inventory, forms, computer hardware and software, computer lines, and supplies.

Commission contracts entered into by the Division under this subsection shall provide for the payment of compensation on a per transaction basis. The collection of the highway use tax shall be considered a separate transaction for which one dollar and twenty-seven cents (\$1.27) compensation shall be paid. The performance at the same time of one or more of the remaining transactions listed in this subsection shall be considered a single transaction for which one dollar and forty-three cents (\$1.43) compensation shall be paid.

A transaction is any of the following activities:



- (9) Collection of the highway use tax.
- (10) Acceptance of a temporary lien filing."

**SECTION 2.** G.S. 20-63 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

"(h2) All commission contractors and their designated employees shall be commissioned as notaries public by the Secretary of State's office. If a commission contractor or the contractor's employee notarizes a document required to be notarized by law or by the Division, the fees for such notarial acts shall be those prescribed in G.S. 10B-31 for the first signature and one dollar (\$1.00) for each additional signature, up to a total of seven dollars (\$7.00), and shall be retained by the commission contractor as part of the consideration allowed pursuant to the commission contract."

**SECTION 3.** This act becomes effective October 1, 2009.
