1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2 AN ACT TO DIRECT THE REVENUE LAWS STUDY COMMITTEE TO STUDY
3 POLICIES AND INCENTIVES THAT CAN BE ESTABLISHED TO STIMULATE THE
4 CREATION OF DEVELOPMENT READY SITES TO AID IN JOB RECRUITMENT
5 AND RETENTION EFFORTS.

6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

7 **SECTION 1.** Study. – The Revenue Laws Study Committee shall study the issue
8 of enacting incentives, similar to tools for farmland preservation, brownfields redevelopment,
9 historic preservation, and land conservation, to stimulate the creation of "development ready"
10 sites. The study shall include (i) discussion of property tax relief that maintains tax assessment
11 values at agricultural value for "development ready" sites where horizontal infrastructure has
12 been put in place so as to make a site ready for building design and (ii) discussion of income
13 tax deductions or income tax credits for land preservation through land banking, purchase of
14 options, or purchase of development rights; redevelopment of obsolete industrial buildings or
15 areas; rezoning to appropriate zoning classifications; and infrastructure improvements to make
16 sites "development ready." The Committee shall make a report on this issue, including any
17 recommendations or legislative proposals, to the 2012 Regular Session of the 2011 General
18 Assembly upon its convening.

19 **SECTION 2.** In conducting the study described in Section 1 of this act, the
20 Revenue Laws Study Committee cochairs are authorized to appoint an advisory subcommittee
21 and to ask the Local Government Commission to designate an individual to participate in the
22 subcommittee's deliberations in an ex officio, nonvoting capacity. The subcommittee may
23 consist of no more than 18 members and may include no less than five members of the House
24 of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House, no less than five members of the
25 Senate appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and individuals who are not
26 members of the Committee or of the General Assembly, eight of whom represent the following
27 interests:

- 30 (3) Triad Real Estate & Building Industry Coalition.
- 31 (4) North Carolina Association of Realtors.
- 32 (5) NAIOP.
- 33 (6) North Carolina Association of County Commissioners.
- 34 (7) The North Carolina League of Municipalities.
- 35 (8) The North Carolina Tax Collectors Association.



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SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.
