8	<u>(a)</u>	A per	rsonal learning plan is a document that provides an ongoing record of a			
9	student's	learning	g progress. It belongs to the student and will stay with the student throughout			
10	the student's time at a public school in North Carolina. Each student who does not have an					
11	individualized education program as defined in G.S. 115C-106.3 or a personal education plan					
12	2 <u>in accordance with G.S. 115C-105.41 shall have a personal learning plan.</u>					
13	<u>(b)</u>	The p	urposes of a personal learning plan are to:			
14		<u>(1)</u>	Set realistic targets for the student and identify the person who can help the			
15			student achieve it.			
16		<u>(2)</u>	Develop a strategy for dealing with targets that are not achieved or are only			
17			partially achieved.			
18		<u>(3)</u>	Record the student's achievement beyond a purely subject-based focus.			
19		<u>(4)</u>	Ensure a dialog between teachers and students regarding progress.			
20		<u>(5)</u>	Facilitate communication between the student's parents and teachers.			
21	<u>(c)</u>	A per	sonal learning plan shall include the following features:			
22		<u>(1)</u>	An assessment of every student soon after entry into education, forming the			
23			starting point of the plan.			
24		<u>(2)</u>	An agreed strategy, including targets for attainment and achievement.			
25		<u>(3)</u>	The involvement of the student, who will take more responsibility for the			
26			plan as he or she moves through the school.			
27		<u>(4)</u>	The student's evaluation of the curriculum and community learning			
28			opportunities.			
29		<u>(5)</u>	A focus on promoting learning in the school, home, and community.			
30		<u>(6)</u>	A focus on personal, social, and health education.			
31		<u>(7)</u>	A focus on learning about the world of work.			
32		<u>(8)</u>	The promotion of study skills and independent learning.			
33		<u>(9)</u>	An outline of the main responsibilities of the school, the parents, and the			
34			pupil.			
35		<u>(10)</u>	Use of information and communication technology.
