6 **PART I. INTRODUCTION AND TITLE OF ACT**

7
8 **INTRODUCTION**

9 **SECTION 1.1.** The appropriations made in this act are for maximum amounts
10 necessary to provide the services and accomplish the purposes described in the budget. Savings
11 shall be effected where the total amounts appropriated are not required to perform these
12 services and accomplish these purposes and, except as allowed by the State Budget Act, or this
13 act, the savings shall revert to the appropriate fund at the end of the fiscal year as provided in
14 G.S. 143C-1-2(b).

16 **TITLE**

17 **SECTION 1.2.** This act shall be known as "The Current Operations and Capital
18 Improvements Appropriations Act of 2012."

20 **PART II. CURRENT OPERATIONS AND EXPANSION/GENERAL FUND**

22 **CURRENT OPERATIONS AND EXPANSION/GENERAL FUND**

23 **SECTION 2.** Appropriations from the General Fund of the State for the
24 maintenance of the State departments, institutions, and agencies, and for other purposes as
25 enumerated, are adjusted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2013, in accordance with the
26 provisions of this act.

28 **PART III. CURRENT OPERATIONS/HIGHWAY FUND**

30 **CURRENT OPERATIONS AND EXPANSION/HIGHWAY FUND**

31 **SECTION 3.** Appropriations from the State Highway Fund for the maintenance
32 and operation of the Department of Transportation and for other purposes as enumerated are
33 adjusted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2013, in accordance with the provisions of this act.

3 **SECTION 4.** Appropriations from the State Highway Trust Fund for the
4 maintenance and operation of the Department of Transportation and for other purposes as
5 enumerated are adjusted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2013, in accordance with the
6 provisions of this act.

10 **DHHS BLOCK GRANTS**

11 **SECTION 5.1.** Appropriations from federal block grant funds are made for the
12 fiscal year ending June 30, 2013, in accordance with the provisions of this act.

14 **NER BLOCK GRANTS**

15 **SECTION 5.2.** Appropriations from federal block grant funds are made for fiscal
16 year ending June 30, 2013, in accordance with the provisions of this act.

18 **PART VI. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS**

20 **STATE BUDGET ACT APPLIES**

21 **SECTION 6.1.** The provisions of the State Budget Act, Chapter 143C of the
22 General Statutes, are reenacted and shall remain in full force and effect and are incorporated in
23 this act by reference.

25 **MOST TEXT APPLIES ONLY TO 2012-2013**

26 **SECTION 6.2.** Except for statutory changes or other provisions that clearly
27 indicate an intention to have effects beyond the 2012-2013 fiscal year, the textual provisions of
28 this act apply only to funds appropriated for, and activities occurring during, the 2012-2013
29 fiscal year.

31 **EFFECT OF HEADINGS**

32 **SECTION 6.3.** The headings to the parts and sections of this act are a convenience
33 to the reader and are for reference only. The headings do not expand, limit, or define the text of
34 this act, except for effective dates referring to a part.

35
36 **SEVERABILITY CLAUSE**

37 **SECTION 6.4.** If any section or provision of this act is declared unconstitutional or
38 invalid by the courts, it does not affect the validity of this act as a whole or any part other than
39 the part so declared to be unconstitutional or invalid.

41 **EFFECTIVE DATE**

42 **SECTION 6.5.** Except as otherwise provided, this act becomes effective July 1,
43 2012.
