A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE JOINT LEGISLATIVE PROGRAM EVALUATION
2 OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE TO DIRECT THE PROGRAM EVALUATION DIVISION
3 TO STUDY THE DIVISION OF MOTOR VEHICLES' COMMISSION CONTRACT
4 FOR THE ISSUANCE OF PLATES AND CERTIFICATES PROGRAM TO DEVELOP
5 OPERATIONAL PRACTICES THAT WOULD RESULT IN INCREASED OPERATING
6 EFFICIENCY.

8 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

9 **SECTION 1.** The Joint Legislative Program Evaluation Oversight Committee shall
10 include in the 2011-2012 Work Plan for the Program Evaluation Division of the General
11 Assembly a study to evaluate the Division of Motor Vehicles' Commission Contract for the
12 Issuance of Plates and Certificates program, authorized in G.S. 20-63(h), to determine the cost-
13 effectiveness and savings that can be effected by changing or maintaining the current operating
14 procedures and to develop any plans or practices that, if implemented, would result in increased
15 operating efficiency of the Division of Motor Vehicles' Commission Contract program.

16 **SECTION 2.** The Program Evaluation Division shall submit its findings and
17 recommendations for Section 1 of this act to the Joint Legislative Program Evaluation
18 Oversight Committee, the Joint Legislative Transportation Oversight Committee, and the Fiscal
19 Research Division at a date to be determined by the Joint Legislative Program Evaluation
20 Oversight Committee.

21 **SECTION 3.** The Commissioner of Motor Vehicles shall not cancel any
22 Commission contracts for any reason other than malfeasance, misfeasance, or nonfeasance of
23 the Commission contractor until the study required by this act is complete and final
24 recommendations have been acted upon by the Joint Legislative Program Evaluation Oversight
25 Committee.

26 **SECTION 4.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
