Instruction shall 14 include the rates of infection among pre-teen and teens of each 15 known sexually transmitted disease and the effects of contracting each sexually transmitted disease. In particular, the instruction shall 16 17 include information about the effects of contracting the Human Papilloma Virus, including sterility and cervical cancer. 18 Teaches about the effectiveness and safety of all FDA-approved 19 b. 20 contraceptive methods in preventing pregnancy, except 21 for drugs such as those marketed under the name "Preven" or "Plan 22 B" or any "equivalent drug product" as defined in G.S. 90-85.27(1) 23 that may cause spontaneous abortions. 24 c. Teaches awareness of sexual assault, sexual abuse, and risk 25 reduction. The instruction and materials shall: 26 1. Focus on healthy relationships. 27 2. Teach students what constitutes sexual assault and sexual abuse, the causes of those behaviors, and risk reduction. 28 29 3. Inform students about resources and reporting procedures if 30 they experience sexual assault or sexual abuse. 31 Examine common misconceptions and stereotypes about 4. sexual assault and sexual abuse. 32 33 Materials used in this instruction shall be age appropriate for use with 34 students. Information conveyed during the instruction shall be objective and 35 based upon scientific research that is peer reviewed and accepted by 36 professionals and credentialed experts in the field of sexual health education. 37 Each local board of education shall adopt a policy and provide a mechanism 38 to allow a parent or a guardian to withdraw his or her child from instruction 39 required under this subdivision."
