2 AN ACT TO PROTECT CERTAIN PERSONAL INFORMATION OF LAW
3 ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS FROM DISCLOSURE.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

5 **SECTION 1.** G.S. 153A-98 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

6 "(c4) Even if considered part of an employee's personnel file, the following information
7 regarding any sworn law enforcement officer shall not be disclosed to an employee or any other
8 person, unless disclosed in accordance with G.S. 132-1.4, or in accordance with G.S. 132-1.10,
9 or for the personal safety of that sworn law enforcement officer or any other person residing in
10 the same residence:

11 (1) Information that might identify the residence of a sworn law enforcement
12 officer.

13 (2) Emergency contact information.

14 (3) Any identifying information as defined in G.S. 14-113.20."

15 **SECTION 2.** G.S. 160A-168 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

16 "(c4) Even if considered part of an employee's personnel file, the following information
17 regarding any sworn law enforcement officer shall not be disclosed to an employee or any other
18 person, unless disclosed in accordance with G.S. 132-1.4, or in accordance with G.S. 132-1.10,
19 or for the personal safety of that sworn law enforcement officer or any other person residing in
20 the same residence:

21 (1) Information that might identify the residence of a sworn law enforcement
22 officer.

23 (2) Emergency contact information.

24 (3) Any identifying information as defined in G.S. 14-113.20."

25 **SECTION 3.** G.S. 132-1.7 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

26 "(b1) Public records shall not include mobile telephone numbers issued by a local, county,
27 or State government to any of the following:

28 (1) A sworn law enforcement officer or nonsworn employee of a public law
29 enforcement agency.

30 (2) An employee of a fire department.

31 (3) Any employee whose duties include responding to an emergency."

32 **SECTION 4.** This act becomes effective October 1, 2015.
