Short Title: Charter School Transportation Grant Program. (Public)

2 AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR A GRANT PROGRAM FOR CHARTER SCHOOLS TO
3 RECEIVE FUNDS TO COVER A CERTAIN PERCENTAGE OF THEIR STUDENT
4 TRANSPORTATION COSTS.

5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

6 SECTION 1. Article 14A of Chapter 115C of the General Statutes is amended by
7 adding a new section to read:

8 "**§ 115C-218.106. Charter School Transportation Grant Program.**

9 (a) Purpose. – The Department of Public Instruction shall establish the Charter School
10 Transportation Grant Program (Program). The purpose of the Program shall be to award grant
11 funds to a charter school meeting the requirements of subsection (b) of this section for the
12 reimbursement of sixty-five percent (65%) of the eligible student transportation costs incurred
13 by the school in accordance with the provisions of this section.

14 (b) Program Eligibility. – If a charter school has a student enrollment of at least fifty
15 percent (50%) of its students residing in households with an income level not in excess of the
16 amount required for a student to qualify for the federal free or reduced-price lunch program in a
17 semester of the school year, the charter school may apply to the Department of Public
18 Instruction for grant funds under the Program for reimbursement of sixty-five percent (65%) of
19 the eligible student transportation costs incurred by the school for that semester.

20 (c) Applications. – By August 1 of each year, the Department shall establish the criteria
21 and guidelines for the grant application process for the upcoming school year, including criteria
22 for eligible student transportation costs to be covered under the Program and any
23 documentation required to be submitted with the application. The Department shall accept
24 applications until December 31 for eligible student transportation costs incurred during the fall
25 semester of the school year and until June 30 for eligible student transportation costs incurred
26 during the spring semester of the school year.

27 (d) Award of Funds. – From funds available for the Program, the Department of Public
28 Instruction shall award grant funds under the Program to charter schools by January 15 for
29 eligible costs incurred during the fall semester of the school year and by July 15 for eligible
30 costs incurred during the spring semester of the prior school year. If the funds appropriated for
31 the Program in a fiscal year are insufficient, the Department may use other funds within the
32 State Public School Fund for this purpose.

33 (e) Reporting. – The Department of Public Instruction shall report by March 15 of each
34 year to the Fiscal Research Division and the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee
35 on the administration of the grant program for the prior year, including (i) the number of
36 charter schools that received grants and the amount of grant funds awarded to those charter



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1 schools, (ii) the types of student transportation costs eligible for reimbursement under the
2 Program, and (iii) an estimate of the cost of the Program for the upcoming fiscal year."

3 **SECTION 2.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of
4 Public Instruction the sum of two million five hundred thousand dollars (\$2,500,000) in
5 recurring funds for the 2017-2018 fiscal year to be used to award grant funds to charter schools
6 for the reimbursement of a percentage of eligible student transportation costs incurred by
7 charter schools in accordance with G.S. 115C-218.106, as enacted by Section 1 of this act.

8 **SECTION 3.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2017.
