	ECTION 1. G.S. 15A-300.1 reads as rewritten:
"§ 15A-300.1	. Restrictions on use of unmanned aircraft systems.
(c) Law Enforcement Exceptions. – Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (b) of this section, the use of unmanned aircraft systems by law enforcement agencies of the State or a political subdivision of the State is not prohibited in the following instances: (1) To counter a high risk of a terrorist attack by a specific individual or	
	organization if the United States Secretary of Homeland Security or the Secretary of the North Carolina Department of Public Safety determines that credible intelligence indicates that such a risk exists.
(2	To conduct surveillance in an area that is within a law enforcement officer's plain view when the officer is in a location the officer has a legal right to be.
(3	If the law enforcement agency first obtains a search warrant authorizing the use of an unmanned aircraft system.
