2 AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO SUPPORT THE GUILFORD COUNTY  
3 SOLUTION TO THE OPIOID PROBLEM WRAP PROJECT THAT WOULD PARTNER  
4 WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL SERVICES AND LAW ENFORCEMENT  
5 AGENCIES WITHIN GUILFORD COUNTY TO SERVE OPIOID-AFFECTED  
6 COMMUNITY MEMBERS.

7 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

8 **SECTION 1.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of Governors  
9 of The University of North Carolina the sum of one million dollars (\$1,000,000) in nonrecurring  
10 funds for the 2022-2023 fiscal year to be allocated to the University of North Carolina at  
11 Greensboro for the Guilford County Solution To the Opioid Problem (GCSTOP) program to do  
12 each of the following for its Wrap project:

- 13 (1) Strengthen and maintain existing GCSTOP programs, including expanding  
14 services to additional locations, increasing mobile outreach capacity with a  
15 focus on medical services at mobile sites, and purchasing technology to  
16 support evidence-based interventions.
- 17 (2) Develop a program in partnership with the Guilford County Department of  
18 Social Services to support evidence-based family intervention for  
19 opioid-affected families.
- 20 (3) In cooperation with the Guilford County Sheriff's Office, the Greensboro  
21 Police Department, and the High Point Police Department, explore the  
22 creation of evidence-based diversion programs that could augment the service  
23 expansion of GCSTOP.

24 **SECTION 2.** The University of North Carolina at Greensboro, in consultation with  
25 the Guilford County Solution To the Opioid Problem (GCSTOP) program, shall report to the  
26 Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Justice and Public Safety and the Joint Legislative  
27 Education Oversight Committee no later than May 1, 2023, regarding the use of the funds  
28 appropriated in this act.

29 **SECTION 3.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2022.
