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HOUSE BILL DRH10320-SA-14

Short Title: Distribute Alcohol Without Discrimination. (Public)

Sponsors: Representative Moffitt.

1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2 AN ACT TO PROHIBIT DISCRIMINATION AND ADVANTAGE IN THE DISTRIBUTION
3 OF SPIRITUOUS LIQUOR TO LOCAL ABC BOARDS.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

5 SECTION 1. G.S. 18B-204 reads as rewritten:

6 "§ 18B-204. State warehouse.

7 (a) Contracting for Private Warehouse. – The Commission shall provide for the receipt,
8 storage, and distribution of spirituous liquor by one of the following methods:

9 (1) By negotiated contract with a privately owned ~~warehouse;~~warehouse.

10 (2) By negotiated contract with privately owned warehouses in several regions of
11 the State. The Commission shall choose locations for the warehouses to
12 promote efficient distribution of spirituous liquor to all local boards, to
13 maintain control of that liquor, and to insure the Commission's supervision of
14 warehousing ~~procedures;~~orprocedures.

15 (3) By the construction of a warehouse, and by contracting for receipt, storage
16 and distribution of spirituous liquor by an independent contractor, by
17 negotiated contract or by the use of procedures for purchase and contract by
18 State agencies, for the operation of that warehouse.

19 (a1) Distribution of Spirituous Liquor; No Discrimination. – The Commission shall make
20 a good-faith effort, without discrimination, to make all spirituous liquor distributed by the
21 Commission available to all local boards. The Commission shall adopt rules regarding the
22 ordering of spirituous liquor by local boards.

23 (a2) Providing Ordering Advantage Prohibited. – A contractor that has entered into a
24 contract pursuant to this section shall not directly or indirectly provide information to a local
25 board which gives any advantage to one board over another board concerning product selection,
26 availability, or otherwise obtaining spirituous liquor distributed by the Commission. Any
27 violation of this subsection by the contractor, an employee of the contractor, or any person
28 working in concert with the contractor shall be grounds for the Commission to terminate the
29 contract.

30 (a3) Limited Product Record Required. – The Commission shall maintain a record of all
31 products that the Commission either (i) limits distribution of due to limited availability or (ii)
32 allocates the distribution of to local boards. The record shall be made available to all local boards
33 and shall include the following for all limited distribution or allocated products received by the
34 Commission:

35 (1) The product code number.

36 (2) The brand name.



- 1 (3) The quantity received by the Commission.
- 2 (4) The date received by the Commission.
- 3 (5) The name of each local board that received the product, the date each local
- 4 board received the product, and the quantity each local board received.
- 5 (b) Audits and Inspections. – Contracts entered into pursuant to this section shall provide
- 6 all of the following:
- 7 (1) That an annual audited financial statement be prepared and submitted to the
- 8 Commission by the person contracting with the ~~Commission~~Commission.
- 9 (2) That all warehouse records be available for inspection at all times by the
- 10 Commission and the Department of ~~Revenue~~and Revenue.
- 11 (3) That all warehouse accounts relating to the receipt, storage, or distribution of
- 12 spirituous liquor be subject to audit by the State Auditor.
- 13 (c) Emergency or Temporary Operation. – If the independent operator of a warehouse
- 14 changes, or if some other occurrence results in substantially impeded distribution of spirituous
- 15 liquor from a warehouse, the Commission may operate that warehouse on an interim emergency
- 16 or temporary basis.
- 17 (d) Rules. – The Commission may adopt rules regarding warehouse operations, and
- 18 violations of those rules by a party with whom the Commission contracts shall be grounds for
- 19 termination by the Commission of a contract entered into under this section."
- 20 **SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2021, and applies to all spirituous
- 21 liquor received or distributed on or after that date.
