A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO MODERNIZE STI TRANSIT FUNDING. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: SECTION 1. G.S. 136-189.10(2)e. reads as rewritten: Public transportation service not included in subdivision (3) or (4) this section. This sub-subdivision includes commuter rail, inter rail, and light rail. Nothing in this sub-subdivision shall be const as authorizing total State funding in excess of the maxing established in sub-subdivision g. of subdivision (3) of this section commuter rail and light rail projects." SECTION 2. G.S. 136-189.10(3)g. reads as rewritten: "g. Public transportation service that spans two or more counties and serves more than one municipality. Programmed funds pursuant to sub-subdivision shall not exceed ten percent (10%) of any distribution region allocation. This sub-subdivision includes commuter intercity rail, and light rail. Total State funding for a commuter rail light rail project shall not exceed the lesser of ten percent (10%) of distribution region allocation or ten percent (10%) of the estim total project costs used during the prioritization scoring process. State shall not be responsible or liable for any project costs in ex of the maximum established under this sub-subdivision. agreement entered into by the State to fund a commuter rail or rail project shall include language setting out the limitations set in this sub-subdivision."
