(3) 23 Aggravated serious injury by reckless boating is a Class I felony. (4) No Double Prosecutions. – No person who has been placed in jeopardy upon a charge 24 (f) 25 of death by reckless boating may be prosecuted for the offense of manslaughter arising out of the 26 same death; and no person who has been placed in jeopardy upon a charge of manslaughter may be prosecuted for death by reckless boating arising out of the same death." 27 **SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective December 1, 2025, and applies to offenses 28 29 committed on or after that date.
