5	SECTION 1. Chapter 90 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new Article

9	"§ 90-21.160. Definitions.			
10	The followin	g definitions apply in this Article:		
11	<u>(1)</u>	Assisted reproductive technology. – All treatments or procedures that include		
12		the handling of human oocytes or human embryos, including in vitro		
13		fertilization, gamete intrafallopian transfer, and zygote intrafallopian transfer.		
14	<u>(2)</u>	<u>Health care provider. – Either of the following:</u>		
15		<u>a.</u> <u>An individual who is licensed, certified, or otherwise authorized under</u>		
16		this Chapter to provide health care services in the ordinary course of		
17		business or practice of a profession or in an approved education or		
18		training program.		
19		<u>b.</u> <u>A health care facility licensed under Chapter 131E of the General</u>		
20		Statutes to provide health care services to patients.		
21		The term "health care provider" includes (i) an agent or employee of a		
22		health care facility that is licensed, certified, or otherwise authorized to		
23		provide health care services, (ii) the officers and directors of a health care		
24		facility, and (iii) an agent or employee of a health care provider who is		
25		licensed, certified, or otherwise authorized to provide health care services.		
26	<u>(3)</u>	<u>Health care service. – A health or medical procedure or service rendered by a</u>		
27		health care provider that meets either of the following criteria:		
28		<u>a.</u> <u>Provides testing, diagnosis, or treatment of a health condition, illness,</u>		
29		<u>injury, or disease.</u>		
30		b. <u>Dispenses drugs, medical devices, medical appliances, or medical</u>		
31		goods for the treatment of a health condition, illness, injury, or disease.

33	Neither the State nor any of its political subdivisions shall prohibit, unreasonably limit, or
