PART II. INCLUDE CLT10 AMONG STANDARDIZED TESTS OFFERED IN HIGH SCHOOL

SECTION 2.(a) Part 3 of Article 10A of Chapter 115C of the General Statutes reads as rewritten:

"Part 3. Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test Opportunities Encouraged. College Preparation Assessments Encouraged.

"§ 115C-174.18. Opportunity to take Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT).various college preparation assessments.

Every student in the eighth through tenth grades who has completed Algebra I or who is in the last month of Algebra I shall be given an opportunity to take a version of either the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT) or (PSAT/NMSQT), the PreACT test, at the discretion of the local school administrative unit, or the CLT10 one time at no cost to the student. A student receiving instruction through a home school, as provided by Part 3 of Article 39 of this Chapter, shall be eligible to participate in testing as provided in G.S. 115C-565.1. The maximum amount of State funds used for this purpose shall be the cost of the PSAT/NMSOT."

SECTION 2.(b) This section applies beginning in the 2025-2026 school year.
