SECTION 1.(a) G.S. 115C-12 is amended by adding the following new subdivisions

- (51)Report on break/fix rate. – The State Board shall report to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee by November 15 of each year on the break/fix rate of technology across all public school units based on the information provided by public school units pursuant to G.S. 115C-47(70), 115C-218.33, 115C-238.66(4a), 115C-150.12C(37), and 116-239.8(b)(6a). The report shall include a summary of the data reported by public school units as well as recommendations to reduce break/fix rates in the future."

SECTION 1.(b) G.S. 115C-47 is amended by adding a new subdivision to read: "(70) Report on break/fix rate. –

- The following definitions shall apply in this subdivision: a.
 - Break/fix rate. The percentage obtained by dividing the 1. number of school technology devices that have been reported as malfunctioning or requiring repair due to physical damage, hardware failure, or other breakage incidents prior to stated life cycle period, not covered by insurance or a policy plan period, by the total number of technology devices in operation during that period.
